Humboldt-Universität zu Berlin (Germany) and the University of KwaZulu-Natal (South Africa), in cooperation with other international partners within the framework of the International Network on Religious Communities and Sustainable Development (IN// RCSD) funded by DAAD cordially invites applications for its Master Class on Religious Communities and Sustainable Development.

COURSE INFORMATION

The course follows a research-based approach to learning. The objectives of the Summer School are to provide MA and PhD students with theoretical and methodological research techniques in religion and sustainable development, which has so far found its way into the curricula of only a few universities. The course offers research training from internationally renowned lecturers with participants receiving an advanced course in qualitative research methods. MA students will have the chance to conduct (small scale) empirical research projects within interdisciplinary teams. PhD students will have the opportunity to network and discuss their respective research projects in a colloquium. The Advanced PhD course will also focus on research ethics, academic writing, and publication. In addition, all participants will have the opportunity to go on thematic excursions to religious/cultural sites in Pietermaritzburg and Durban.
